Montgomery Preservation Sponsors "Montgomery County Cemetery Inventory Revisited"

The history of our community has been documented in the past and shared in various editions of The Little Acorn. However, in December of 2017, this resident became aware of an on-going County initiative that addresses the "neglected, abandoned, undocumented and unmaintained cemeteries in the County and throughout Maryland that often disappear through lack of protection from development and vandalism"

"From 2004-2009 Peerless Rockville led the original initiative to identify and document ALL cemeteries in Montgomery County, resulting in a list of about 325 burial grounds."

With a boost from County Legislators interested in cemetery preservation, a new effort is now underway to update the original survey and to document even <u>more</u> cemeteries. This effort, entitled **The Montgomery County Cemetery Inventory REVISITED Project**, is sponsored by Montgomery Preservation. Volunteers from all over the county will share the workload throughout 2018.

This long-time resident of Darnestown attended the kick-off meeting on January 6th, 2018 during which time the project was introduced. The primary objective is to digitally document the location, surroundings, and condition of each cemetery for inclusion in the County's archives so that website visitors can "see" the cemetery on line. simplify То the process, а map of Montgomery County was divided into 43 "zones" and volunteers were asked to "adopt" a zone.

Did you know that Darnestown (ZONE 19) is the home to at least six historic cemeteries?

I think that you can guess the "rest of this story". Yes, I signed up for Zone 19 and look forward to documenting the following burial grounds:

- Darne Family Cemetery
- Seneca ME Church Cemetery
- James Offutt Family Cemetery
- Peter Family Cemetery
- Query Family Cemetery
- Pleasant Hills Cemetery

While photography is the primary objective, any additional information that adds historical content or specific information is greatly appreciated. Do you have information that you would like to share? Do you know of other cemeteries that may not be on the current list?

NATIONAL CHARITY to HOST ANNUAL GALA in D.C. to RAISE MONEY to SUPPORT YOUTH ENTERING FOSTER CARE

Comfort Cases' 4th Annual Gala will be held on Saturday, May 12, 2018, at the Marriott Marquis in Washington, D.C. The event will feature performances by the Como Brothers Band and comedian/actor Alec Mapa, as well as a seated dinner, silent and live auctions, awards ceremony, and dancing.

Founded in 2013, Comfort Cases, headquartered in Rockville, MD, is dedicated to serving youth entering foster care not only in MD/DC/VA, but also nationwide. To date, Comfort Cases has served more than 30,000 people ng the tough transition into foster care. The recipients range from newborns to the age of 21 in 32 states and Washington, D.C.

Proceeds from the Gala will support the mission of providing "Comfort Cases", which include new backpacks/duffel bags packed with new pajamas, blankets, stuffed animals, dental and hygiene kits, journals with pens/pencils or coloring books with crayons, and books. Additionally, each Case includes a large duffel bag for recipients to carry their personal items along their journey. Without a Comfort Case, those entering foster care typically carry the few belongings they may have to call their own in trash bags used as a 'suitcase'. Items in each Comfort Cases assist youth as they transition into a new foster home, but, more importantly, provide a sense of dignity and self-worth.

"These items were especially meaningful to me as I grew up in the foster care system," says Rob Scheer, the Founder of Comfort Cases. "Today, we pack thousands of cases each year for youth as young as newborns entering foster care and transitioning between foster care families. Our Gala, its sponsors, and every attendee will influence our mission in remarkable ways." Comfort Cases has experienced tremendous growth since its inception, and was applauded for its mission with a feature on The Ellen Show last summer. Additionally, Derek Jeter Publishing recently announced the acquisition of the imprint for a memoir written about the Founder of Comfort Cases' life story to be While Comfort Cases is published in 2018. taking steps toward national expansion, the need to rally support is powerfully pressing to respond to the 437,500 youth in foster care across the U.S. The Gala serves as the largest annual fundraiser for Comfort Cases, and supporters are implored to sponsor and attend the impactful special evening.

The black-tie optional Gala will feature funny guy, Alec Mapa, who has entertained audiences worldwide and is known for his uproarious live performances and groundbreaking television roles. Musical guests, from Long Island, New York combine an urban-pop and rock sound with a blues vibe. Having written and recorded multiple albums and EP's of original songs, The Como Brothers are premier singer-songwriters with ties to industry legends John Mayer, The Saturday Night Live Band, and Taylor Swift.

The event will feature both live and silent auctions featuring items donated by numerous sponsors, organizations and individuals.

Sue's Reviews

THE SHAPE OF WATER

"The Shape of Water" is a 123-minute R Rated Fantasy/Thriller directed by Guillermo del Toro starring Sally Hawkins (Elisa Esposito), Michael Shannon (Col. Richard Strickland), Richard Jenkins (Giles), Octavia Spencer (Zelda) and Doug Jones (The Asset).

The film is set in Baltimore in 1962 in the background of the Cold War era. Elisa is a mute cleaning lady working in a secret high-security government laboratory. She and her colleague, Zelda, discover a bizarre, scaly, water-dwelling creature from South America that is brought to the facility as a classified secret. Elisa develops a unique bond with the creature and does everything she can to protect him from hostile government agents.

Hollywood saves its best movies for the end of the year and this is no exception. "The Shape of Water" is a visuallystimulating, emotionally-engrossing adventure which is simultaneously a spy thriller, science fiction odyssey and erotic love story. It has a well-written script with cleverlyplaced comedic relief to balance out the gory and violent scenes. Del Toro, a master storyteller, has created a masterpiece with exceptional photography, lighting, sets, costumes and cars which recreate 1962 Baltimore. The acting/casting is uniformly excellent, especially Hawkins, who deserves an Oscar nomination for her passionate portrayal of a poor, mute woman who finds love in the most unexpected place. Shannon, who never disappoints, is extraordinarily effective in his creepy, sadistic role and the supporting cast members, especially Spencer and Jenkins, also deliver noteworthy performances.

The plot subtly but expertly weaves in (but does not dwell on) important social issues such as racism, homophobia, sexism and cold-war intimidation, in the context of the 1960s. I was surprised at how emotionally-connected I felt watching this movie, especially the last twenty-minutes which had me laughing, cheering and crying. The satisfying ending is totally unpredictable. Even though this is classified as a science fiction/thriller, I think it is the best love story to appear on the big-screen this year. I give "The Shape of Water" a 10.0 on the ABBONDANZOMETER (Scale of 1-10).







I, TONYA

"I, Tonya" is a 119-minute R Rated Biographical Sports/Drama directed by Craig Gillepsie starring Margot Robbie (Tonya Harding), Sebastian Stan (Jeff Gillooly), Allison Janney (LaVona Golden), Bobby Cannavale (Hard Copy Producer), Caitlin Carver (Nancy Kerrigan) and McKenna Grace (Young Tonya Harding).

This film depicts the amazing rise of Tonya Harding from a low-socioeconomic class child who was often referred to as "white trash" in Portland, OR, to a famous US Olympic figure skater. She started skating at age 3 and was the first American woman to complete a triple axel in competition. The movie's momentum builds to the dramatic, infamous event which is most often associated with Harding: the 1994 baton attack on her rival and Olympic teammate, Nancy Kerrigan. Her exhusband, Jeff Gillooly, his best friend and accomplices were implicated in the attack which resulted in the end of Harding's skating career. According to the prologue, the movie is based on interviews with Harding and Gillooly.

"I, Tonya" is one of the best movies of the year. It is entertaining, informative, funny and sad at the appropriate times. This compelling dark comedy effectively recounts the extraordinary story of one of the most sensational scandals in sports history. I love everything about it, especially its engrossing true story (which I followed more than any that year, until the murders of Nicole Brown Simpson and Ronald Goldman). The casting and iconic acting of Margot Robbie and Allison Janney (both of whom I think deserve Academy Awards) are fantastic. The retro soundtrack mix including hits by Chicago, Heart, Doris Day, Dire Straits (and others) serves as an effective back-drop to the smooth plot progression. The photography is amazing, especially the close-up skating scenes. The film ends with a moving, informative epilogue which concludes with Harding's historic triple axel and photos of the real characters. I did not look at my watch once and did not want this riveting movie to end.

The best thing about "I,Tonya", however, is the amazing insight it provides into Harding's stamina and determination. She was able to rise above verbally, emotionally and physically abusive relationships with her mother and husband to become an Olympian and the second most well-known person in the world after Bill Clinton.

At times, her story seems too wacky to be believed, but from everything I have read, it is true. I think this film should receive numerous Oscar nominations and I recommend it to anyone who is interested in historic dramas, figure-skating, or biopics of well-known figures in American sports history. I give "I, Tonya" a 9.5 on the ABBONDANZOMETER (Scale of 1-10).

POULTRY SWAP

The Maryland Poultry Swap & Farmer's Market will be hosting its semi-annual swap down on the farm this spring on April 22^{nd} , from 8:00 AM – 2:00 PM.

Homemade Tomato Pie

Grease a 9-inch pie pan.

Combine & Spread in pie pan for the crust:

- 1¼ cup Flour
- ¹/₂ teaspoon basil or 1 tbsp. fresh
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- ½ cup Crisco or other shortening
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup regular sour cream

Layer the following:

- Fry Bacon 5-6 slices crumble
- Peel & Slice 5-6 tomatoes To peel tomatoes, place in water that has been boiled & turned off for 1-minute. The skin will slide right off of them!

Mix & Spread on Top:

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 tbsp. minced onion

Bake at 375 for 30-35 minutes until crust is golden brown.

Those Who Serve – Wreaths Across America

Tradition. The dictionary offers the definition as "the transmission of customs or beliefs from generation to generation, or the fact of being passed on in this way". Darnestown has been included in this definition by the events that have shaped our community in the past two centuries. Whether it is the forging of new transportation routes, agricultural endeavors, or military actions, Darnestownians have been at the heart of the action.

Some of the traditions that we have celebrated here in Darnestown include Darnestown History Day, highwaylined flags on federal holidays, the Spring Social, the Fall Hoedown, and the Christmas tree lighting are the ones that stand out in our minds. But wait! We now have a brand, new tradition to count among our celebrations.

Imagine the surprise when it was discovered that over 74 of our neighbors, veterans of American military conflicts from the Civil War to Vietnam, are interred in the Darnestown Presbyterian Church Cemetery! Shortly after this discovery, a national celebration known as *Wreaths Across America* was introduced to Darnestown. It was neither by accident nor by a national concern that our little village was sought out for this honor, but rather by "tradition makers" who gathered support from the community to choreograph a remembrance of the individual sacrifices made by our local veterans for our country.

Not only did the "tradition makers" develop the idea of bringing the national celebration to our corner of the world, but they organized the event, spearheaded the fundraising for the event, arranged for our local military dignitaries to place wreaths in honor of all US branches of the services, arranged for brief dedications, and garnered support from the Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts as ceremony participants and reception sponsors. The gathering was also honored to welcome our very own DCA President Lisa Patterson-Troike, who made a brief presentation on behalf of the Darnestown Civic Association and community, as well as a few old veterans standing in the audience of approximately two hundred people from inside and outside of the community. So, who are the "tradition makers" who spearheaded this idea? None other than Bill and Sue Gooch, actively supported by the members of their motorcycle club, The Independent Civilians. As the name applies, the club's selfless actions focuses on community service with a particular focus on supporting our military personnel, past and present. With their vision, dedication, and hard work, we as a community have been further enriched. I should also mention that the *Wreaths Across America* ceremony would not have been successful without the overwhelming generosity of our citizens who contributed by financially sponsoring the program through the purchase of wreaths.

And there we have it - A cohesive gathering of the young, the old, and the veterans' community, thus establishing a new and honored Darnestown tradition!

We are the 4th Grade class at Seneca Academy. We wanted to introduce you to our Head of School and to tell you about a really cool experience that we had in January!

Our Head of School is Dr. Michelle Parker. She was born in Washington, DC. Dr. Parker earned her PhD in Clinical Psychology from George Washington University. She came to our school from Sidwell Friends where she was the Head of Counseling. Before that, she was a high school chemistry teacher! She wanted to be a principal because she loves being a part of helping kids learn how to be good citizens and good problem solvers. She also likes to be "a part of the magic of inspiring kids to be curious about the world around them." We asked her if it is hard to be a principal and she said that it is hard but very worthwhile. Dr. Parker said that she chose Seneca Academy because it felt like "a perfect village" to her from the moment she entered the building!

Dr. Parker always wanted to work with children. She loves being a psychologist because it taught her how to think about kids and their development, and what they need to be strong and healthy. She used to play "teacher" with her friends and her stuffed animals when she was a little girl. So even though she loved her counseling job, she especially loves teaching. So, she came to us in 2016 to be our Head of School.

Dr. Parker's favorite foods are French baguettes and cheese, and her favorite color is blue because she loves everything having to do with water, the beach, and sailing. She has three children, she speaks fluent Spanish, and she loves working in our multi-cultural village here at Seneca Academy. We are really glad to have her here, too!

The other thing we wanted to tell you about is the really cool field trip we went on in January. We had been studying the American Revolution, the US Constitution, and the Bill of Rights in an IB Inquiry Unit that centered on our government's main documents, how and why they were written, and how hard it was for our Founding Fathers to accomplish their goals. For example, we learned that even though the Declaration of Independence was written by Thomas Jefferson in 1776, the US Constitution wasn't written until 1787 – 11 years later! We also learned that James Madison, who had taken notes during all of the meetings that the founding fathers had, wrote the Constitution based on all of those notes. (And this was before computers!) Everyone disagreed on what exactly should be in the Constitution, so several compromises had to be reached so they could move forward with making our new government. Even then, it took almost a year for the first nine states to ratify, which means 'approve', the Constitution. The first state to ratify the Constitution was Delaware, which is why its nickname is "The First State".

We especially liked learning about the Bill of Rights (particularly the First and Fourth Amendments), and how democracy is different from dictatorships and other kinds of harsh governments.

But the GREATEST experience we had was when went on a field trip to Washington, DC to meet with Senator Chris Van Hollen, our State Senator! We arrived in DC at about 11:30 am, so we ate our lunches in the courtyard of the Hart Building before going inside. On our way to Sen. Van Hollen's office, we met the bodyguard of Sen. Orrin Hatch, R-Utah, who gave us some energy drinks and let us look into the Senator's office!

When we arrived at Sen. Van Hollen's office, we were taken to his main meeting room. He joined us a few minutes later, and we sat at his big meeting table with him. The Senator stayed with us for about half an hour, and he answered all of our questions! He explained how a bill is discussed and passed into law, how the Senators reach compromise, how government budgets work, and how important children's education issues are to him.

He also told us that he had met and worked with President Obama many times, but he hasn't worked with President Trump yet, and he was looking forward to that opportunity.

Studying our country's founding documents and our government was super interesting, but meeting Senator Van Hollen was really special! It was definitely one of the coolest and most educational experiences of our lives!

RENOVATING OUR CAMPUS

For the first time in five decades, our church is planning to implement major changes to our extended campus. For the last several years we have been exploring options for a broad-based modernization, and during that period we have undertaken many tasks essential to moving the project forward. We hired an architect with significant experience in church design and renovation, and have reviewed several iterations of plans tailored to our design needs. We have worked closely with Montgomery County authorities to design a new septic system and to obtain approval from the county Historic Preservation Commission for proposed changes to our campus. While we have not yet cleared all obstacles, nor made a final decision to proceed, our commitment to this renovation is strong and we are hoping to break ground this summer. Our goal is to provide for future generations what our predecessors bequeathed to us - a church and campus that effectively welcome the people of Darnestown to the worship of God.
