Downtown Village – Support Your Local Retailers!

Harris Teeter — A heartfelt thank you goes out to all the store employees, including the pharmacy, who have been providing our community with all the additional pandemic needs!

Darnestown Center — For well over 30 years, one Darnestown resident and landlord has been providing our community with commercial space occupied by retail, offices, and service providers. This 16,000 square-foot two building property in the southwest corner of Darnestown and Seneca Roads currently has space available to meet a variety of needs. Contact Greater Potomac Realty at 301-840-1616.

14115 Seneca Road — A lease has been signed and three tenants are in the process of moving in and getting County sign approvals, etc.: Kerrana Kangen Water (301-518-9554), Johnson Chimney Service (844-Dr Chimney) and Dryer Vent Experts (844-372-4466).

14124 Seneca Road — SPI Seneca received final site plan approval in early February for the three planned residential homes on the 7-acre parcel at 14124 Seneca Road (directly across from the Mary of Nazareth driveway, vacant restaurant property and Guardians). Mitchell & Best is marketing these three two-acre lots. An adjacent one-acre parcel under the same ownership is planned as a fourth residential home.

14112 Seneca Road — Previously approved for a restaurant (country inn) back in 2005 with a special

exception (now expired) to use supplemental septic capacity on the adjoining property, Scheer Partners now has this 1.8+ acre vacant property listed for sale. Interestingly, years back the property supported a bank branch.

Darnestown Shell Station — The station continues to add services after completing renovations a year ago. There's now an ATM, ice machine, and propane exchanges in addition to being a full-service gas station with licensed mechanics.

Other Darnestown Projects

Darnestown Station — Six lots were sold to home builder, Craftmark Homes, last year at 13610 Darnestown Road. Craftmark is in the process of marketing homes to be built (from \$1.4+ million) and infrastructure construction is underway.

Seneca Farms — The project received final site plan approval in December 2021. This subdivision is now in the process of having the 27 lots recorded

on the plat map to be filed with the County so likely not too much physical activity on site for several months.

14300 Seneca Road — This 45+ acre property that is currently improved with a single-family home was sold last year to a member of the local Rickman family. At this time, the property is reportedly not being subdivided.

Our Rural Past and Our Rural Future

Roads Task Force — rtf@darnestowncivic.org

During the fall of 1998 Montgomery Planning surveyed 420 Darnestown and Travilah (DT/T) households as part of their research effort for our most recent and currently in effect 2002 Potomac Subregion Master Plan. The other survey areas were Potomac (308 respondents) and North Potomac (301 respondents). What follows are some highlights for your enjoyment and consideration.

KEY FINDINGS

- 1. "... respondents there [in Darnestown and Travilah] are particularly concerned about retaining the rural ambiance."
- "Darnestown and Travilah are ... most concerned with overdevelopment."
- "... traffic is particularly disliked in Darnestown and Travilah ..."
- 4. "Darnestown and Travilah residents are less interested in improved lighting than residents of other areas and more interested in traffic control, consistent with their more rural surroundings."





"Of the survey areas, Darnestown and Travilah residents are the most worried about **speeding** ..." followed by concerns with cut through traffic and congestion.

PARKS AND TRAILS



"Quiet is extremely attractive to Darnestown and Travilah residents where more than 35% selected it as what they like most." Followed by being near parks and having large lots.



83% of Darnestown and Travilah respondents said they are familiar with and go to the C&O Canal.

Related to trails "The only significant difference among the survey areas was a stronger preference for natural surface trails in the Darnestown and Travilah area ... consistent with the comparatively rural character of the area."

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT



"Darnestown and Travilah residents are most likely to participate in a civic association if there is one. In that area, 66% of those who have a local civic association nearby participate."

"Local organization **newsletters** are particularly important resources in Darnestown and Travilah ..."

.................



Darnestown and Travilah residents were most interested in participating [contributing further to the master plan process], 72% said yes.

"Darnestown and Travilah are farther from buildout than Potomac and may have more issues related to potential growth."

Public meetings and civic association meetings "are most popular in Darnestown and Travilah where they" were as popular as web site and email participation.

ENVIRONMENT



"The preference for environmental protection is most apparent in Darnestown and Travilah where 76% of respondents chose environmental protection as the higher priority" Overdevelopment was cited as the most important environmental problem facing the area with pollution being second.

"Darnestown and Travilah residents have a particular concern about too many deer..."



"Darnestown and Travilah residents are the most unified, with a strong preference for spread out lots, 66% compared to 26% for clustering."



84% of Darnestown and Travilah residents wanted no **new nearby stores** but six percent did want more restaurants as well as grocery stores. [One down one to go, unless you count Windridge and Rocklands, as well as Inferno and others just a short hop away.]

As a community overall we are consistent, specific, and active. We are currently facing down being a named Center of Activity in the County's new general plan. We are also advocating to contain the development footprint across the county.

Q&A with Adele Williams

In 2020, Adele Williams was the recipient of the DCA's Bruce Deppa Scholarship. We caught up with Adele to see what she's been up to.

Q: Where and what are you doing now?

Q: What do you miss most about Darnestown?

A: The obvious answer would be the weather. No snowzilla or snowmageddon that went through

Q: Are there certain experiences you reflect back on as you face new challenges in college life?

A: When I struggle with time management or leadership, I think back to my time running clubs and volunteering in high school. It can be hard to manage my college obligations' time constraints, but I have clarity when I remember the skills I learned growing up.

Q: What do you enjoy most about college life?

A: I love the freedom and fluidity of college life. One day I may have class and a club meeting, but I can easily hop on the bus and visit my friends or see a concert. While I appreciate the education I got growing up, a 7:45 am to 2:30 pm rigid schedule could get tiring. Each of my classes meets twice a week, so we can go much more in-depth with the material, and I stay engaged. The ever-changing and evolving complexities of college life are why I enjoy it so much.

Darnestown Says Goodbye to South Trimble Lynn, Sr.

July 28, 1927–January 8, 2022



South Trimble Lynn, Sr. of Darnestown, Maryland, died peacefully in his home (Southland Farm) on Saturday, January 8, 2022 at the age of 94. Loving husband of Joanne Minter Lynn; loving father of

Elizabeth Lynn Perraud (Art), South Trimble Lynn, Jr. (Bettina), Sprigg Singleton Lynn (Dawn). Also survived by seven grandchildren, and two great grandchildren.

Born in 1927, South Lynn's boyhood was spent in Washington, DC. South joined the Navy on his 17th birthday in 1944, signing up for the war's duration plus 6 months.

South finished high school in DC after the war and earned a B.S. in Business and Public Administration at the University of Maryland in 1952. Working seven months at a flooring company, South figured he could do as well as his boss, so started his own Universal Floors, Inc. in 1953, becoming a thriving flooring contractor located in Washington, DC. Early 1960's floor work introduced South to our area, compelling him to buy land and build a home.


In 1973 he and several friends purchased the Kennedy Farm in Washington County, Maryland, and restored this National Historic Landmark to the snapshot from an important time in American history. In 2010 South won the John Frye Historic Preservation Award in Washington County.

South was a member of Sons of the American Revolution, Sons of Confederate Veterans, the Masons, and the Lions Club. He was also a member of The Society of the Cincinnati, one of the few who was a direct descendant of an officer serving under General George Washington.

P.E.O. is a Philanthropic Educational Organization where women celebrate the advancement of women through education. P.E.O. was founded in 1869 placing it among the oldest women's organizations in North America. Originally begun as a friendship society at Iowa Wesleyan College in Mount Pleasant, Iowa, P.E.O. has evolved into one of the largest nonsectarian, community-based organizations with nearly 6,000 chapters and almost a quarter of a million members. P.E.O. has chapters in each of the 50 states, the District of Columbia and in the six Canadian provinces.

As a philanthropic organization, P.E.O. supports six philanthropies that include ownership of Cottey College, a women's college in Nevada, MO, and five programs that provide higher educational assistance to women through scholarships, grants, awards, and loans. 
