Many Darnestown Elementary School parents and students reading this are familiar with Darnestown Colonial Day, a day in which the gym transforms into a quaint

18th century village. The predecessor to Colonial Day (even fewer may recall this) was the 5th grade class trek to Colonial Williamsburg, an overnight, two-day trip. It was a huge deal to us kids but it didn't come without a price.

Our teacher Luanne Deppa, a Darnestown legend and cherished 5th grade teacher for decades, told us that we couldn't just have our parents pay for the trip. No, we had to earn it on our own. We had to find a way to make \$60 ... on our own. And so, at \$2 an hour working for our next-door neighbor, I tracked the hours I mowed, trimmed, and carried piles of brush (the worst) to earn the \$60 for the trip.

It was a very different world back in the '80s. The term "on-demand" didn't exist, there were only about 7 channels on TV (maybe a couple more if you adjusted the antenna perfectly), and the closest thing to the internet was a set of encyclopedias. To survive as a kid, you had to rely much more on your own ingenuity and creativity.

It's with that (admittedly curmudgeon) perspective that I continue to be amazed at the youth of Darnestown. The DCA Scholarship Program is in its third year and we're again granting \$1,000 scholarships to two gradu

ating high school seniors this month. The experiences and accomplishments on the applications that have come in over the past few years have been amazing. The first year we had one official scholarship but were so impressed that felt compelled to give two. That second scholarship was soon funded by Luanne Deppa and is in memory of her husband Bruce, a long-time DCA president and Darnestown champion. Even last year we were so impressed we gave out three scholarships.

If the academic, athletic, and artistic accomplishments weren't impressive enough, the involvement and leadership in other groups and activities at the same time is amazing. I appreciate that everything—school, sports, getting into college—is much more competitive than it used to be and kids are pushed harder. But what I find most striking, particularly as that competition forces kids to spend more time and specialize earlier, is the drive and initiative that the kids take to come out of high school well rounded.

I guess I thought that because the world is literally "on demand" at their fingertips that would equate to a lack of initiative, which isn't the case at all. If you've come out to one of the Farmers and Artists Market you've seen it front and center—several vendor stands of just Darnestown kids featuring their creative work and entrepreneurial spirit.

While much of the credit should go to our parents and the kids themselves, it also goes to the people in many of the institutions we have right here in town that foster that initiative and provide opportunities for a well-rounded upbringing. This includes the teachers in our public and private schools, church youth group leaders, Boys & Girls Scout troop leaders, swim club coaches, and summer and adventure camp staff ... just to name a few. We have a wonderful environment for kids to flourish and should be proud of the culture that's developed within our community.

DCA's Welcome Committee Year in Review

Every couple of months several DCA Welcome Committee volunteers create welcome bags for new Darnestown residents that are personally delivered to new homeowners. Did you know:

- As of April 2022, there were over 80 homes sold in Darnestown in the last 11 months.
- Sale prices ranged from \$575,000 to \$2.6 million with an average sale price of over \$1.0 million.
- Homes range in size from three to six bedrooms, with the average home having four or more bedrooms.
- A representative survey of these home sales for seller/prior homeowner tenure revealed that on average "Darnestowners" occupy their homes for approximately 22 years.
- Anecdotally, although we don't connect with all the new residents, the majority of new homeowners have moved locally or have prior knowledge of/connection with Darnestown.

On the Road Again [7]

You have probably noticed changes in the traffic patterns in our community.

Some things remain the same—drivers go too fast. yield to distraction, and are aggressive first and courteous second. Let's see if we can turn the corner and reduce speeds, stay focused, and be exceptionally courteous. We can't wait for a safer, more comfortable experience on the road again.

Volume on our neighborhood streets seems to have increased as more people work from home, use delivery services, and more pedestrians are sharing the road. Please remember your multi-ton vehicle is a threat to pedestrians and cyclists. Deference to the slower party is the rule. It is your duty to give-way and alter your speed and direction to eliminate your threat. Your need to give-way also applies to vehicles you encounter. Please be especially cognizant of your responsibility to defer in high encounter, close quarters like parking lots and neighborhood streets.

Pedestrians also have responsibilities. Many of our roads do not have shoulders or sidewalks. Pedestrians on these roads have a duty to stay at the very edges of the roadways when they choose to share the road. Everyone acting in the safest manner possible is in everyone's best interest.


On our main roads we see reduced daily volumes.

Traffic on MD-28 Darnestown Road is at the lowest levels of the last ten years. Even so, at times, the uncontrolled intersections on MD-28 are perilous and need immediate and long-term mitigations.

Esworthy Road is also in need of immediate and longterm mitigations as it continues to take exceedingly high-level volumes on what is meant to be a neighborhood rural road

Much of the main road volume we see is from what we call corridor overflow or cut-through traffic. The development of Germantown, Clarksburg, Urbana, and Frederick puts strain on the I-270 corridor. We want corridor overflow traffic disincentivized to travel through Darnestown. Those who frequent MD-28 during peak times know right away if there are incidents in the corridor as they experience the inundation of overflow traffic.

The Roads Task Force is a group of volunteers and we encourage you to join us. We act as a source of validation, agency, and standing for those who seek to make a difference. We aid in vetting well considered approaches in line with the tenants of proactive well-reasoned advocacy. We help deliver and present a facilitated public discourse and provide a backstop and management guidance. We are excited to work with you to increase safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all.



It's a Darne' Good Cookbook

If you have ever been to the Farmers and Artists Market and passed by the DCA booth, you may have spotted It's a Darne' Good Cookbook that was printed in 1992. In this book, there are recipes submitted by Darnestown residents, including an entire section devoted to historical recipes for things like butter, hush puppies and beef jerky. At the last market, I was lucky enough to meet Michelina Ganassa, who was part of the book's tasting committee. According to Lina, "when I passed by your booth, I was reminiscing about the days when the cookbook was being planned. Not only did recipes get collected and submitted, but also had to pass the taste test by the tasting committee which I was a part of. If the recipe tasted good, it was submitted. Much time and work went into the cookbook." There were 1200 recipes submitted from more than 200 people and of those recipes, 484 were selected.

To kick off the summer, here is a recipe for a Maryland tradition, "A Maryland Crab Feast" from the historical section of *It's a Darne' Good Cookbook*. And if you have extra crab meat after your feast, you can use the leftovers in many of the crab recipes found in the book. Don't have a copy of the book? No problem! Stop by the DCA booth at any of our Darnestown events.

A Maryland Crab Feast

Use 2 1/2 dozen large hard shell crabs for 6 people. Wash live crabs with a hose, if necessary. A lard can with tight fitting lid is a good container for steaming -- holding just 2 1/2 dozen. Put grating in bottom of pan, add 3 cups vinegar, 4 tablespoons salt, 4 tablespoons dry mustard, 4 teaspoons black pepper, 1 teaspoon red pepper and 1 teaspoon tabasco. When this is boiling rapidly, put in the crabs -- kicking vigorously. When steam rises hard, count time for 20 minutes. The crabs will turn bright red.

Spread a table with a thick layer of newspapers. Provide each guest with a paring knife, nut cracker or heavy handled knife to break claws. Paper towels and beer.

Every man for himself now. A tray of steamed crabs in the center of the table. Remove the top shell, feelers, apron and discard the graywhite spongy "dead men's fingers" and the intestines. Break the claw shell and split the body to get at the meat. Don't neglect the greenish crab fat -- it is a delicacy.

Chiari Malformation

A serious neurological disorder where the bottom part

of the brain ("cerebellum") descends out of the skull and crowds the spinal cord. This puts pressure on both the brain and spine, and disrupts the normal flow of cerebrospinal fluid (csf).

Syringomyelia

A serious neurological disorder where a fluid-filled cyst ("syrinx"), develops inside the spinal cord, stretching the cord and damaging nerve tissue. Up to 90% of cases involve a chiari malformation, spinal cord injury, tumors, and arachnoiditis.

Why syrinx's form are not known, but might involve the abnormal flow of cerebrospinal fluid (csf).

ESPN's Tim Kurkjian Talks Baseball in Darnestown!

Darnestown's own Tim Kurkjian, the well-known ESPN baseball analyst, entertained a large group of baseball fans over breakfast on April 9th in Darnestown Presbyterian Church's Fellowship Hall. Tim shared entertaining baseball stories as only he

can, followed by a free-flowing Q&A period. Among the highlights were Tim's takes on the evolving nature of the game—from efforts to speed up play (he's in favor), to the adoption of the Designated Hitter in both leagues (he's against it), to the "feast-or-famine" prevalence of home runs and strikeouts in the game today (he laments it). Tim also celebrated some of the historic young stars of today's game, including the National's Juan Soto and the Angel's Shohei Ohtani, whose achievements have already staked a claim to baseball history.

Another subject—raised not by Tim but by those in attendance—was his recent selection for the Baseball Writers Association of America Career Excellence Award. The annual award recognizes a single sportswriter "for meritorious contributions to baseball writing" during the Baseball Hall of Fame's July induction weekend in Cooperstown, NY. This is a real capstone to Tim's career, and reflects not only his achievements at ESPN, but also his service at the old Washington Star, the Dallas Morning News, the Baltimore Sun and Sports Illustrated, plus his three books. He is only the 72nd person so honored, and he follows such luminaries as Ring Lardner, Grantland Rice, Damon Runyon, and Shirley Povich. Tim was at pains to say that this does not represent actual induction into the Hall of Fame, but this is the highest honor that a baseball writer/reporter can receive!

"Be a Hero for a Hero"

Darnestown Residents Have Opportunity to Raise Future Service Dogs for Wounded Warriors

Service dogs aren't simply born into the role—they're raised and trained through the support of a team and community. Warrior Canine Connection (WCC), headquartered in Boyds, is recruiting neighbors in the Darnestown community to join their team of "Puppy Parents."

WCC's Puppy Parents provide stable homes, care, and training for future service dogs for military service members and veterans. Almost anyone can apply to become a Puppy Parent. WCC has volunteers ranging from college students to retirees who take on this important role. If you have kids or pets in your home, WCC will match you with the right puppy for your household.

I recently met with experienced Puppy Parent Marielena McGuire and her service-dog-in-training, a 6-month-old Golden Retriever named "Stacie." Marielena started volunteering for WCC in 2017, helping to clean kennels and greet newborn puppies before taking on the task of puppy parenting. Stacie is Mari-

elena's second WCC puppy. On the day we met, Stacie was practicing basic socialization and polite behavior in the At Home store in the Kentlands. We met outside where Marielena introduced me to her pup and told me about her volunteer work. As we spoke, her eyes carefully caught the leaf blowing down the sidewalk, the landscaper using noisy equipment, and the large truck approaching the parking lot—every

detail that might seem mundane or even invisible to us, but becomes a valuable learning experience for a future service dog, whose mission is to remain calm and focused in any environment. Marielena delivered carefully timed treats to her puppy, and rewarding the dog's appropriate responses, before we headed inside to watch Stacie work indoors.

One of the many benefits of being a Puppy Parent is getting to take your puppy almost everywhere with you. These service-dogs-in-training have access to most public spaces, so they can (and should) accompany you grocery shopping, at the office, or dining on the patio at your favorite café, expanding their social experiences as they learn and grow.

This may sound like a big commitment—which it is but all Puppy Parents receive the training and support of the staff and volunteers of WCC. There is no prior experience required to become a Puppy Parent. New "parents" begin by attending a series of three one-hour classes and one-on-one training before being matched with their first puppy to raise. Once they receive their puppy—a Labrador Retriever or a Golden Retriever between eight and ten weeks old—they will attend weekly group training classes together at WCC's Boyds facility. Volunteers receive guidance and help throughout the entire process—including access to a private Facebook group with other Puppy Parents and puppy-sitting services when traveling. WCC also provides a service dog vest, a leash, collar, and crate, as well as all food and veterinary care.

Marielena said it's extremely fulfilling and rewarding to watch your puppy advance through the various levels of training and, "It's amazing what these dogs can do. They know when you're upset or not feeling well."

When your WCC puppy is approximately 12-18 months old, it's time to handle what may be the most challenging part of your work as a volunteer—saying goodbye. Once your puppy-parenting job is complete, your dog will return to WCC headquarters for advanced service dog training; and if your pup doesn't meet the high-level requirements for service work, they will make a "career change" and be placed in a valuable role as a companion (pet) dog to a military person or veteran.

When discussing the challenge of returning her first dog to WCC for advanced training, Marielena said, "There were tears, but you go into it knowing the dog is going back and they are going to make such a difference in someone's life that it's worth it."
