### **Darnestown Softball Excitement!**

Darnestown neighborhood softball was in full swing with a beautiful Opening Day April 14th. The Central Darnestown Swingers (CDS) took on Western Darnestown (WD) in the early game battling back and forth before closing out the seventh inning and game in a 12-12 tie well beyond the late-game start time. The late game featured Jones Lane (JL) crushing defending champion Bondy-Haddonfield-Ridgefield (BHR) 28-17, to include some generous scorekeeping to pad BHR's stats!

We've now been blessed with seven Sunday's of typical Darnestown spring softball weather—nearly perfect on Opening Day, cloudy and quite cool for Week 2, and then hot and sunny (but not too humid) through the Father's Day break with one rain out. Jones Lane is leading the pack with a lot of solid defense and the occasional onslaught of powerhouse hitting. Will this be JL's year to take home the championship trophy?

The play of the year, thus far, has to be BHR's shortstop Darren Straniero's running and leaping catch robbing CDS's Carrie McIntyre of a for-sure two-RBI line-drive in the top of the seventh inning in Week 3. The catch ended the top half of the inning with the bases loaded and provided BHR the momentum to ring up seven runs to tie the score 12-12 at the end of regulation. Ultimately, CDS was able to recover from the seventh inning meltdown scoring four runs in the ninth while holding BHR to two to secure the win.

# Max Esposito Named All-American

Congratulations to Darnestown's Max Esposito for being named All-American by USA Lacrosse Magazine. The list was revealed in May and Esposito claimed honorable mention honors. All-Americans were chosen by USA Lacrosse Magazine staff and contributors with input from coaches and conferences across the country. Esposito is claiming the honor for the first time.



Max, a former Northwest High School graduate, currently attends Concordia University Wisconsin where he will be entering his senior year. Along with All-American, Esposito has a long list of other achievements in his college lacrosse career. In 2024 he was Northern Athletics Collegiate

Conference (NACC) Offensive Player of the Year, a frist Team All-Conference selection, team captain, and set numerous school and conference offensive scoring



records. During his junior season, Esposito broke two NACC records in single season points and assists with 137 points, 69 goals and 68 assists. He scored a goal in all but one contest in 2024. Max has an outstanding record off the field as well, where scholastically he has been on the Dean's List and in June, was recognized as a USILA Scholar All-American. Max will graduate next spring and plans on coaching lacrosse after college.

### **Darne Bloomers Garden Club**

In February, the Darne Bloomers Garden Club meet at Bretton Woods Recreation Club for a dynamic presentation by Kathy Jantz on the many benefits of incorporating ground-covers into lawns and gardens. Kathy is the author of two books, *Groundcover Revolution* and *The Urban Garden*, as well as editor of *Washington Gardener* magazine, president of the Silver Spring Garden Club, and host of the DC Garden podcast. She is also a local gardener herself and a major fan of groundcovers for the many benefits they offer, including weed suppression, replacing grass in hard-to-grow areas, providing food and shelter for pollinators, birds,



and wildlife, serving as living/green mulch, and reducing mowing, use of chemicals, and soil erosion and compaction. In the course of her presentation, Kathy introduced us to groundcover options for lawn substitutes,

Selected groundcover plants

such as liriope, creeping rosemary and thyme, and sedums, as well as tough problem solvers for high shade areas including hellebores, ferns, cranesbill geranium, and bugleweed. Her presentation left us with a new perspective on some of our favorite plants. Who knew hostas, strawberries, lily of the valley, and Lamb's Ear were groundcovers?

For our March meeting, we met at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Kentlands for a different perspective on gardening presented by Claudia Kousoulas, author of Private Gardens of the Potomac and Chesapeake. Claudia worked in urban planning before her interest expanded to include landscape design. Her presentation was an informative step back from a focus on individual plants to more over-arching principles of garden design, including unseen engineering (e.g., watering systems for roof-top gardens), design goals (e.g., creating a peaceful garden around a swimming pool), and whole-site views (e.g., slow reveals of trees and gardens while moving through a site), and her concepts were illustrated with striking slides of local sites showing the interplay between structural elements and landscape design. Claudia also discussed hard and soft scaping to frame garden views and the concept of the garden as artwork when viewed through a window.

For our hands-on activity in April, Lisa Ruf of Goodness Gracious Florals demonstrated how to create a hand-tied European-style bouquet, after which members were provided with an assortment of gorgeous blooms provided by Amy Kurtenbach of Pleasant Hills Specialty Flower Farm, assorted greens, baling wire, and cellophane to create their own bouquets. Creating the bouquet begins with holding two flowers with stems crossed in your hand, then adding blooms and greens crosswise, rotating and adjusting the bouquet as you go to ensure that flowers are in different planes, filling in spaces, adding items of interest, and making sure that the stems are flared out below. Once the



bouquets have been completed, they are wrapped with baling wire, and the stems are trimmed to an even length on the bottom so the bouquet can stand by itself. The bouquet can then be wrapped in cellophane, and

the cellophane filled with water to serve as a vase. While Lisa, whose record number of stems for this type of bouquet is 65(!) made this technique look easy, it proved pretty challenging when we put it into action. Despite the dexterity challenges faced during the activity, it is clearly a skill worth practicing, as every member left with a beautiful bouquet.

For our year-end May meeting, the Darne Bloomers traveled to Monkton, MD for a tour of the Ladew House and Topiary Gardens followed by lunch. The Darne Bloomers Garden Club meets the second Thursday of every month from September through May, typically at Bretton Woods Recreation Club.
