President's Corner

Notes from the President



I can't think of a more thankless job than leading a school boundary change. Multiple factors to balance, passionate parents on all sides with different perspectives, and in the end there's no way to make everyone happy. With the new Crown High School set to open in the fall of 2027, Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) is in the middle of that right now—a boundary study that won't change where kids go to elementary school but will impact where they go to middle school and high school after that. These studies don't happen too often, and it's likely the decisions made will dictate where our kids go to school for the next two decades. It's been a very confusing process but bear with me, I'm going to do my best to make sense of it.

Executing a school boundary change is a challenge, but the MCPS School Board hasn't made it any easier for themselves, or for parents. In addition to the typical factors to sort out—school capacity over time, bus routes, demographics, etc.—there are two big variables driving the boundary decisions that won't be decided until the very end of the process:

1. Will the new Crown HS be its own actual high school with dedicated students or will it be a holding school...or a combination of both? Because of the renovation work needed in schools across the County and a lack of space to temporarily house students during construction, the Schools Superintendent wants to evaluate Crown to be used in full, or in part, as a holding school.
2. What will the final high school 'regions' look like? If you haven't heard of high school 'regions' yet, it's because they don't exist ... yet. In a nutshell, MCPS wants to align articulation paths within six regions across the County, meaning they want kids from an elementary school in a specific region to also feed into middle schools and high schools in the same region. The regions are not

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finalized but the option below appears to be the direction things are going.

The Boundary Study has released its 8 final options, and a recommendation is expected by the Superintendent of Schools this January '26, with a Board vote for final approval in March '26. Changes take effect in the fall of '27.

So, what do the options look like for Darnestown? Well, for Jones Lane Elementary it's pretty simple—it is aligned to Region 5 and all 8 options have Jones Lane feeding into Ridgeview MS and then Quince Orchard HS. Darnestown Elementary School is a little more complicated. DES has been aligned to Region 6 and all 8 options have DES feeding into Kingsview MS. Six of those options then have DES feeding into Northwest HS, one option to Poolesville HS, and one option splitting DES—the northwest part of Darnestown going to Poolesville HS, the southeast portion going to Northwest HS.

When evaluating these options, particularly for DES, it's important to understand how we got here:


- Spring '25: The Boundary Study released their first set of 4 options. These options are no longer valid, but all of

them had DES going to Quince Orchard HS and either Ridgeview MS or Lakelands Park MS. To many in Darnestown that made logical sense—the new Crown HS would be pulling students from several nearby high schools, including Quince Orchard, and DES would slide from going to Northwest HS to Quince Orchard HS, which is generally much closer.

- October '25:

- » Prior to releasing new options in October, the Boundary Study decided to coordinate with another concurrent MCPS study, the Academic Programs Analysis. That study introduced the 'regions' concept, with the goal to offer the County's specialized academic programs in high schools within each of the six regions, rather than offering in just one or a couple of select County high schools. This approach will reduce travel time and improve accessibility of these programs. The concept of 'regions' then entered the Boundary Study discussion.
- » Also prior to the new options in October, facility utilization and enrollment projections were updated and adjusted.
- » The 4 options released by the Boundary Study in

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October replaced the original spring options, and had DES in Region 6, going to Kingsview MS and either Northwest HS or Poolesville HS

- » Based on an initial survey of DES parents and residents after those options came out, the DCA petitioned the School Board to include some version of the original spring options (Quince Orchard, Lakelands Park MS, Ridgeview MS) in the final set of 4 additional options to be released in December.
- December '25:
 - » The additional 4 options were released, all with DES still in Region 6, going to Kingsview MS and either Northwest HS or Poolesville HS.

Effectively, the County is pushing that DES should be part of the upcounty Region 6, which means it needs to attend schools in that region—Kingsview MS and either Northwest HS or Poolesville HS. And if your

kids will be part of any specialized academic programs, it will most likely be in a high school in Region 6. The primary concerns raised by Darnestown parents and residents around the current options are the driving distance/bus times and that the schools in those very first set of options (Quince Orchard HS, Lakelands Park MS, and Ridgeview MS) are closer, a more logical extension of our community and the direction that most of us go for other activities outside of school. A huge concern expressed by parents is keeping DES students together through high school and not having them split (i.e. the one option where part of Darnestown goes to Poolesville HS, the other part to Northwest HS).

So where do we go from here? By the time you're reading this, the formal MCPS feedback survey will have closed and we'll be expecting the Superintendent's recommendation soon. The DCA will continue to communicate out the latest updates and will begin discussing in January if additional advocacy efforts should be supported.



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the programs for the upcoming year was sent to members ahead of the meeting, and following breakfast, our Programs Chair, Pam Baer, and Assistant Chair, Amy Gross, drew names to sign up hosts for upcoming activities.

As always, the programs include a mix of presentations and hands on activities. This year's programs include: an October visit to Abernethy & Spencer Greenhouse and Garden Center, a newly revitalized 100-year-old garden center in Purcellville, VA; a hands-on activity creating fall centerpieces in November; a holiday lecture and demonstration in December on how and why we grow herbs for tea provided by Kari Barrett; and a hands-on activity making tea-cup floral arrangements in January. Rounding out the new year, there will be a landscape architecture lecture on garden planning and design in February; a presentation by Chef Ryan Jones on how he incorporates fresh herbs in his recipes in March; and our annual hands-on service project in April creating bedside bouquets for local assisted living centers. Several optional field trips were also discussed. The year will end with our annual May luncheon at Surreybrooke Gardens in Middletown, MD, with a guided tour followed by a catered luncheon. Following breakfast and sign-up activities, the newly formed committees held break-out sessions to brainstorm ideas for their committees.



October

At our October 9th meeting, members traveled to Purcellville, VA on a beautiful fall day for a tour of Abernethy & Spencer, an expansive greenhouse

and garden center located on 9+ acres. The 100-year-old site, originally named Hilltop Plant Farm, was purchased by the current owners less than two years ago on a hand-shake deal to keep the site as a nursery. Since then, they

have been working diligently to expand and improve the property while preserving its heritage. Members shared a light breakfast in a new Glass Room event location built to house small gatherings and activities. From there, we were given a complete tour of the facility. Original to the nursery are a large central greenhouse of annuals, herbs, and vegetables, as well as two glasshouses that were transferred after the end of World War II from the Arlington Experimental Farm that was located on the site of the Pentagon, with the first, the Geranium House, containing the largest section of scented and Martha Washington geraniums on the East Coast, and the second housing mainly succulents and cacti. Other features include 12 perennial houses and 5 native perennial houses, with plans to organize native plants by region in the spring, as well as a houseplant and tropical greenhouse, a large selection of trees and shrubs, and a native plant walking trail. Following the tour, members browsed The Conservatory, a restored historical greenhouse that houses a gift and garden shop, café, library and orchidarium.

For our November meeting, the club met at Bretton Woods to create fall floral centerpieces.
